

UPDATE ON AIRPORT COMMUNICATION CENTER COMPUTER AIDED DISPATCH UPGRADE PROJECT

SUMMARY

This update is to provide the Committee a briefing on the acquisition of a Computer Aided Dispatch System ('CAD'), which is included in the FY 2025 adopted budget. Pending completion of the project contract documents, this item will be brought back to the Committee for recommendation to the Commission for approval.

BACKGROUND

CAD is an integral part of a modern first responder Communications Center. The system integrates incoming calls of various types (telephone; radio; alarm system, etc.) and from other sources such as Public, Police, Fire, Maintenance and Operations displaying on one screen allowing dispatchers to evaluate and respond. This system also prompts the dispatcher to collect consistent focused information to be relayed to the appropriate responders.

Currently, the Airport Communication System utilizes a manual method system for the Airport Operations, Police Department and Fire Department.

A needs assessment was performed as well as market research to determine a potential CAD system that would be useable and affordable to implement at the Airport, and discovered the following:

- 1. CAD systems are very expensive. The cities of Burbank, Glendale and Pasadena have replaced their respective systems in recent years at a cost of between \$3 million and \$4.6 million.
- While any modern CAD system is likely to be capable of meeting the needs of the Airport, two are commonly in use in the tri-city area, Tiburon and Versaterm. Versaterm, is in use by the Airport's primary mutual aid partner, the Burbank Police Department ("BPD"). Glendale Police Department utilizes Tiburon and the Pasadena Police Department employs Versaterm.
- 3. Versaterm is a modular system, allowing the Airport to create an "add-on" module within an existing system to accommodate and support the Airport CAD needs, with significant cost savings versus a standalone system. This modular system also provides significant efficiency to the operational and administrative relationship between BPD and the Airport Police Department ("APD").

4. During Staff's research, all three cities' Police Departments employed the services of a consultant to implement their respective systems. The Cities all used the same consultant company, CIT Com. The assessment of the performance of this consultant by the involved staff at the Tri-Cities was unanimously favorable.

To assist the development of this project, Staff researched the potential to utilize the consultant services of CIT and the potential to tie into the Versaterm system at BPD. CIT was contracted for an initial amount of \$10,000 through a Professional Services Agreement. Staff are currently working on a quote from Versaterm based on a standard implementation, along with a detailed Statement of Work.

Staff reviewed the 2013 Law Enforcement Cooperative Agreement, more commonly known as a Mutual Aid Agreement, between BPD and APD. This Agreement anticipated the potential sharing of BPD's CAD system (formerly "Tiburon", now Versaterm) in the body of the 2013 Agreement. Airport and Burbank City Staff are currently working to revise the language in the Mutual Aid Agreement to reflect the shared use of BPD's Versaterm system.

ESTIMATED COST

If the Committee recommends and the Commission approves, the cost to implement a Versaterm CAD system with the initial system training is anticipated to be accommodated in the FY 2025 adopted budget appropriation of \$300,000. Future costs for this system including additional training, annual subscription and operating costs are estimated to be \$155,000 per year. When costs and documentation are finalized, Staff will return to the Committee to present the proposed project for its consideration at a later date.
