Job Description

Painter

Reports to: Supervisor, Maintenance

Status: Non-Exempt

Description:

Under general supervision, to perform journey level work in applying airfield and roadway surface markings; perform minor asphalt pavement repairs and perform other facilities maintenance as required.

Essential Job Functions

Typical Tasks:

- Paints exterior of structures and equipment; paints, varnishes, lacquers, enamels interior of buildings, including patching surfaces, and painting and finishing newly made partitions, window casings, doors, cabinets, cases, plaster and woodwork; paints roadway pavement markings utilizing walking and riding painting machines
- Makes equipment and material preparations for painting jobs
- Prepares and mixes paints, varnishes and shellacs; selects, harmonizes and mixes colors in proper proportions; mixes and applies putty
- Fills, paints, varnishes, shellacs and finishes furniture and equipment
- Operates spray gun and other mechanical painting equipment
- Tapes and finishes drywall; hangs wall coverings
- May be required to paint signs
- Performs periodic asphalt pavement repairs as needed to comply with FAA Part 139
- Supervises the work of helpers
 - Perform other job-related duties as assigned

Traffic Painter:

- Paints and stencils traffic pavement markings as well as striping on streets and curbs using a spray gun and brush
- Assists in locating and spotting center and lane lines and other traffic markings for new and resurfaced roads
- Removes old stripes and markings using a power grinder or sandblasting equipment; spreads oil and rock to reseal surfaces
- Places warning signs, flags, and cone barricades at work sites; acts as flagman as required
- Keeps spray guns, stencils, brushes, line striping machines, and other paint equipment in serviceable condition
- Spreads glass beads on newly painted lines and markings
- Maintains daily record of work completed
- May refer to traffic painting work orders and plans to locate curb and pavement markings
- Installs traffic regulatory, warning, guide, and construction signs
- Operates power equipment such as augers, electric hammers, drills, tampers, compressors, and line striping machines
- Cleans, lubricates, and makes minor operating emergency repairs to a variety of sign posting power equipment
- Brush paints metal parts of traffic signals, signal standards, mast arms and controller boxes

Minimum Qualifications

Employment Standards:

- Possession or ability to obtain before appointment a valid California Driver License, Class C or higher
- Obtain and maintain security clearance as required by the Airport Security Plan and TSA

Knowledge of:

- Methods used in graining, rubbing, wiping brushing, spraying and finishing with paint, stain and varnish
- Qualities and uses of paints, varnishes, shellacs, driers and fillers
- Practices necessary to maintain and care for painting equipment
- Tools and equipment used in drywall or stucco repair, surface painting, and pavement painting

Supplemental Information

Ability to:

- Work at the journey level preparing, painting and refinishing interior and exterior surfaces, equipment and other materials
- Judge when paints are at the proper consistency to achieve specified results
- Set up and operate spray equipment including compressors and power units
- Mix paints to achieve a desirable affect when matching or contrasting colors and textures
- Erect ladders and portable light towers to ensure the safety of those working around or on such equipment
- Read and comprehend job diagrams, sketches, or written instructions
- Supervise helpers assigned to assist on various projects
- Learn and understand State and local laws, ordinances, codes, and regulations pertaining to all aspects of painting and the handling and proper disposal of painting materials and supplies
- Work with the hand tools and power tools characteristic of the trade
- Learn and perform asphalt pavement repairs as needed
- Lift, push, pull, move or carry over 50 pounds, climb ladders
- Learn and understand FAA Part 139 requirements and FAA Advisory Circular recommendations on painted airfield signs and markings
- Use best practices for operating ladders and other apparatus
